1. Define the five categories of use on the substance use continuum
2. Explain the rationale for universal screening
3. Perform brief assessment, brief intervention, and appropriate referrals with adult patients
4. Examine common barriers to administering high-quality SBIRT systematically to all patients and how to overcome those
